Project outputs, results

The activities and the events of the international project "Development of sustainable twinning network between East and West", implemented by the Europe for Citizens Programme (2007-2013), took place six times in different towns of partner municipalities. International participants from Boxholm (Sweden), Tukums (Latvia), Plunge (Lithuania), Martano (Italy), Quickborn (Germany), Andrychow (Poland) and Blato (Croatia) municipalities came to venues. Local participants were involved directly in project activities, hundreds of people were involved indirectly – due the public events, conferences, workshops, discussions, publicity campaigns.

Partners were actively engaged in the development thematic and long lasting cooperation between towns and were highly interested in its success and further cooperation, which had features of complementary, modernity, and joint use.
